John XXIII was a visionary pope who was responsible for calling Vatican II into being. 

From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

We had a wonderful **Holy Week**. The special liturgies for each day of the Triduum went extremely well. A lot of hard work went into the planning. Again I want to thank our choir, our liturgical ministers, sacristans, decorator, Altar Society, church staff, maintenance, landscaping! You served us in such a wonderful way!

Today marks the conclusion to the **Octave of Easter**. It is the eighth day, the day of new creation. This is the day on which Christ appeared to the fearful and disheartened disciples with a word of "Peace." But by no means do we "conclude" Easter. The liturgical season of Easter lasts for 50 days and officially "concludes" with the solemn feast of Pentecost on June 8.

We will have a special Mass celebration as we rejoice in the movement of the Holy Spirit, creating unity in diversity. Easter is really a daily reality in every Christian's life because it is one of the two prongs of the paschal mystery dying/rising that defines Christian living. It is a challenge to keep Easter joy throughout the 50 days of our Easter season.

One concrete sign of the presence of new life in our communities is the **neophytes** who made their profession of faith as a Catholic, were confirmed and brought to the table of the Word and Eucharist at the Easter vigil. Please continue to pray for them that their faith in the Resurrected Christ grow stronger each day.

Today is also known as **Divine Mercy Sunday**, established by Pope John Paul II when he canonized the Polish Saint Faustina Kowalska on April 30, 2000. This day recognizes the abundant mercy of God offered to us through Christ. With great faith and joy, John Paul II understood the Resurrection.

He described it as a "miracle of mercy". What exactly is mercy? Mercy is compassion shown to an offender. It is forgiveness extended to someone who doesn't deserve it. Today's gospel sets before us the beautiful example of the mercy of Jesus after the Resurrection. In this first encounter with his apostles since they deserted him, Jesus is not angry with them. No, he blesses them: "Peace be with you." That's amazing! But Jesus does more than incarnate divine mercy. He challenges us to extend mercy to one another. We can do this by practicing the corporal and spiritual works of mercy: feed the hungry, clothe the naked, visit the sick and imprisoned, shelter the homeless, comfort the sorrowful, etc. Other ways include speaking kindly to others, refraining from gossip, giving someone another chance. May God bless all of us. Have a great week!
