Am I already "saved"?

My neighbor is a fundamentalist Christian. He said I won't be "saved" unless I accept Jesus as my personal savior. Didn't Jesus become my savior when I was baptized?

Your neighbor is probably referring to John 3:7, when Jesus told Nicodemus, "You must be born anew." Jesus is talking about a spiritual rebirth; we must have a spiritual birth in order to be saved. As you have correctly noted, Catholics believe this happens at baptism. In John 3:5, Jesus says, "No one can enter the kingdom of God without being born of water and Spirit."

We are saved by the waters of baptism. But for Catholics, it's not merely a one-time event. We continue to accept or reject the salvation offered us by the decisions we make every day.

Your neighbor used the words "personal savior." Catholic Christians go even deeper through the sacraments. We develop and nurture a very personal relationship with Jesus by regularly receiving the Eucharist. In the sacrament of reconciliation, we admit we have sinned and ask Jesus to forgive us. And in the sacrament of confirmation, our relationship is "sealed" with the gift of the Spirit.

Many Catholics also celebrate the sacrament of marriage. The couple's personal relationship with Jesus is deepened through the love the couple shares.

So tell your neighbor you are indeed saved by Jesus. And because you are saved, you deepen that relationship with Jesus by living a sacramental life.

From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Some years ago the bishops of Biloxi transferred the Solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday of the 6th week of Easter to the following Sunday in order to allow more people to participate in this wonderful feast. Thus, on this weekend we are celebrating the Ascension of the Lord. In the reading from the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, we hear the account about the early disciples witnessing the Lord Jesus ascending to heaven: "As they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. Suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood before them and said, 'Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way."" It seems to me that the message to the Church is that while we await the return of the Lord, we are not to stand around doing nothing. We are urged to become actively engaged in building the Kingdom and spreading the message of the Gospel by word and deed. Through our Baptism and Confirmation we are commissioned to continue the mission of Jesus in our times, especially through the witness of our lives by being involved in parish ministry and community outreach. The Ascension marks the end of one phase in the story of salvation and the beginning of another. In the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, God both revealed his plan for us and brought about the renewal of our lives. What was begun in the earthly life and ministry of Christ was meant to be continued through the centuries in the living community of the disciples of Jesus. Thus, the purpose for the existence of the Church is revealed. Called into being by the Easter message, the Christian community is established in order to keep alive the memory of the Lord Jesus and to bear witness before the world to all that Jesus said and did. This great mission involves both faith and action. We need to proclaim the story of Jesus and his teaching but we also need to give witness to our faith by embodying in our daily lives

all that Jesus stands for. While this is beyond our human capabilities, it becomes possible through the power of the Holy Spirit. It is the Spirit who calls us and shapes us into the body of Christ and assures us that Jesus is with us "until the end of the age."

May God bless all of us.
