
The world calls this phenomenon the triumph of the human spirit; I'm convinced



In this special liturgy the Church emphasizes two principal dimensions of our Catholic faith concerning the Eucharist. The first is the reaffirmation of our belief in the reality of Christ's real presence in the Eucharist. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood with his soul and divinity." Another important aspect of our faith that finds emphasis in this great feast is the fact that we are to become what we receive, i.e.

We become the Body of Christ for others. We the Church, the People of God gathered together by the Lord to celebrate the sacred mysteries, are also sent forth as the Lord's saving presence in love to the ends of the earth. We are to embody the teaching of Jesus that we find in the Gospel of John, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world" (John 6:51).

This Friday, June 27, we celebrate The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. This solemn feast is celebrated on the Friday following the solemn feast of the Body and Blood of Christ. God has loved us with a human heart. God is not a God who is unapproachable and inaccessible; rather, God has drawn near to us through Christ's human heart. God fulfills our very need and gives us new life. Then on Saturday, we celebrate the feast of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast is a kind of liturgical sister to the solemnity of the Sacred Heart. Mary is a model for us all, not only in terms of keeping the words of scripture in our hearts, but also in the words of our life experiences. Have a great week and may God bless all of us!
