Is it OK to donate my body to science?





I know the Church approves of organ donation under the right circumstances, but what about donating my entire body to science?

Christians believe death is ultimately defeated in God's gift of a new creation. This new and eternal creation is made possible by the Lord Jesus Christ, who "will change our mortal bodies to be like his in glory, for he is risen, the firstborn from the dead" (Order of Christian Funerals, 402).

Resurrection, then, is not a return to earthly life. Our bodies are not resuscitated like Lazarus' (see John 11), but are resurrected like Christ's, transformed and glorified. Christians traditionally revere the body—alive and at death—because we are created in God's image. Some people reason that such respect prevents donating the body to science, but that is not the opinion of the Church.

In his 1956 allocution to physicians, Pope Pius XII said, "A person may will to dispose of one's body and to destine it to ends that are useful, morally irreproachable, and even noble, among them the desire to aid the sick and suffering. One may make a decision of this nature with respect to one's own body with full realization of the reverence which is due it."

Such a self-giving act in death—in consultation with family members or health care providers—is a supreme manifestation of Christ in what it means to be Christian.



From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Gospel today describes a turning point in the mission and ministry of Jesus. Jesus challenges his disciples with the question about his identity. They had heard him preach about the Kingdom of Heaven, especially through parables, and witnessed his many miracles. They had even been invited to share in his way of life. Now Jesus asked them about what others were saying about him and his message. Clearly the stories indicated that people viewed Jesus as an extraordinary individual and many wondered if he might not be one of the great prophets sent by God. However, all these views fell short of the mark. Thus, Jesus turned to the disciples and asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" It is a question that has confronted believers throughout the centuries and still requires a personal response from those who choose to be his disciples today. Matthew's Gospel tells us that it is Simon Peter who speaks on behalf of the other disciples. He affirms that Jesus is the Messiah (Christos in Greek and the Anointed One in English) who comes to bring God's gift of salvation. Peter then goes on to state that Jesus is the Son of the living God. Jesus responds to Peter's profession of faith by declaring that this testimony was the result of a revelation from God and it was meant not just for Peter but for the whole Church. Peter is given a special role in the community of faith and is promised the keys of the Kingdom. This role remains permanently in the Church and is fulfilled by the Bishop of Rome, the successor of Peter. That is why Pope Francis emphasized at the very beginning of his pontificate that he was first the bishop of Rome and thus called to exercise Petrine ministry for the good of the universal Church. Also implied in this Gospel

account is the decision by Jesus to hand over his mission and ministry to the apostles. After his Ascension Jesus would entrust this awesome task to weak human beings like Peter and the other early disciples. In other words, Jesus placed the future direction of the Church in the hands of people like you and me. We might keep this in mind when we step forward to participate for various forms of ministry in our parish. Each generation of disciples must renew their faith in Jesus as the Christ and also renew their commitment to be actively engaged in furthering the Kingdom of Heaven.
