Once they have their mottoes, I ask them to reflect on what it would look like if they lived with the motto always on their mind. The exercise helps focus people on what they do well and on what needs a little work.

Over the years, I've returned frequently to the beginning of the epistle:

"Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another." I remember when I've done that well and when, driven by anger, fear, or ego, I've fallen far short of the ideal. It has always appealed to me as a wonderful motto.

Today, however, I'm struck by the second half of this reading: "It is the hour now for you to wake from sleep... Put on the Lord Jesus Christ."

I think there are many times when we're asleep and unaware of how we hurt others by what we say and do.

What if we saw everything as Christ did, touched everyone as Christ touched them?

If we put on Christ, we wouldn't need to tell people which words we hope will guide us. We'd simply become the living example of them.
