# How should parents discipline children at Mass?

I'm tired of being distracted by children sliding around in the pews, fidgeting constantly, and giggling with each other. How would the priest like parents to handle these situations during Mass?

I presume you mean children between the ages of two and six—kids too old to be crying in their parents' arms and too young to be in religious-education programs. Many parishes have children's Liturgy of the Word programs, but the kids still spend time at regular Mass.

It's important for kids to be at Mass and to learn to be quiet for an hour. When children come to Mass, they slowly get used to the idea that they're expected to behave for a limited amount of time.

Parents should bring books or soft toys—anything that won't make more noise—to keep the kids entertained. They shouldn't let their kids bring musical toys, electronic games with sound effects, or toy trucks that can be run up and down the pews. If children continue to be disruptive, parents should take them outside for a short time and then bring them back.

Bottom line: Priests want children to come to Mass. It's better to have fidgeting kids at Mass than no kids at all. We want them to learn to behave now so when they get older they're ready to deepen their participation in the Mass.

## From Father Khoa's Desk...

## Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Gospel today presented us with instruction from Jesus, and is given to these elders and chief priests by Jesus in the parable of the King who hosted a wedding banquet and celebration for his son. Many who had been invited to come to the celebration paid no attention to the invitation, and continued onward with their own plans, agendas, and activities. Some of the invitees even laid hold of the servants of the King, abusing some of them, and even murdering others! The King responded very decisively by eliminating those original invitees, burning their city, and sending a much wider message of invitation out to any who would honor his recently wed son, and would graciously be present there for the festivities. This second invitation on the part of the King resulted in a full banquet hall. As the King went into the celebration to mix with the guests, he came across someone who was not properly attired for a wedding celebration. Scripture scholars interpret this to mean that this particular invitee had not reflected on the full scope of the privilege and blessing that this invitation was to him, and to all of his fellow attendees. This improperly attired invitee, the Scriptural experts say, was present at the celebration physically, but not wholly and fully present. He had not entered into the spirit of the celebration, and very likely remained unengaged and detached, and had only come out of selfish or self-serving motivation. Still other scholarly experts propose that this invitee did not evidence, in the least, any trace of having been called, and so cordially and thoughtfully invited and included, as well as no indication of what transformative change or conversion to which this invitation and call might lead in his life. We would do well to reflect on and to ponder the blessing and gift that is The Lord's call to us! We would also do well to be ever engaged, connected, consciously purposeful and intentionally grateful in responding to this very special call and invitation from The Lord of Heaven and Earth!
