Why pray for the dead?

Every year I go to Mass on the anniversary of my grandmother's death to pray for her soul. My Protestant friend thinks it's strange that Catholics pray for the dead. Can you help me explain it to him?

Love reaches across time and space, even across the divide of death. One of the articles of the Apostles' Creed affirms our belief in the *communion of saints*, the spiritual bond between the souls in heaven (all of them, not just the canonized) and purgatory and the faithful still alive on Earth. All are united with Christ and with one another in grace, prayer, and good works (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 946–948).

We're praying for them, and they're praying for us.

If your friend is looking for a scriptural basis for praying for the dead, you can direct her to two passages. In the Old Testament, 2 Maccabees 12:38–46, Jewish soldiers pray and offer sacrifices for fallen comrades who had gotten mixed up with pagan practices: "He made atonement for the dead that they might be absolved from their

sin" (46). This is held to be a good and holy practice done in expectation of the resurrection of the dead.

In the New Testament, 2 Timothy 1:18, Paul speaks of praying for God's mercy on a deceased man named Onesiphorus: "May the Lord grant him to find mercy from the Lord on that day" of judgment.

May the souls of the departed rest in peace.

From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

This Sunday we celebrate the feast of **All Souls Day** and we commemorate all the faithful departed. While it is a special time to remember our loved ones who have died, it is also a sober reminder that all of us will die one day. Dying is part of the reality of all human existence but we need not be hopelessly afraid of death or plunged into despair. "In the face of death the Church confidently proclaims that God has created each person for eternal life and that Jesus, the Son of God, by his death and resurrection, has broken the chains of sin and death that bound humanity"

In today's Gospel reading from St. John 6:37-40 we see that it is the will of God that we not be lost, but that we be raised up and live with God forever in heaven. We may need some purification when we die because of the temporal punishment due to our sins. From the very beginning the Church has honored the memory of those who have died by remembering them in prayer, both privately and in the liturgy. In special place is the remembrance of the deceased in the celebration of the Eucharist: "Remember also our brothers and sisters who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection, and all who have died in your mercy; welcome them into the light of your face" (Eucharistic Prayer No. 2).

This feast also reminds us of the importance and meaning of our Baptism. In one of the Scripture texts recommended for the second reading at the Mass, St. Paul teaches us that "we were indeed buried with Christ through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life" (Romans 6:4). We have been baptized and the Spirit of God has been poured into us. We are God's children, sharing in the gift of God's very own life of grace. We are assured that

this spark of God's life in us will not be extinguished at death. This is God's promise to us and the reason for our hope in eternal life. Hope is really a gift of God's love, anchored in the reality that "while we were still sinners Christ died for us." Because of this gift of hope we pray for the faithful departed. Because of this hope we face our own death with deep trust in God's promises. And St. Paul reassures us that this hope does not disappoint.



Remember to change your clocks this weekend: we fall back one hour.
