That's a fine metaphor for what we need to do with our souls.

Advent is the time to check the dark recesses for thoughts and actions that indicate we're less than ready to meet Christ face to face.

Advent is the time to sweep away the cobwebs and put our inner house in order, knowing that Christ is on his way.

Maybe in the midst of cooking and cleaning the house we live in, we can find the time for prayer and reconciliation so that when he comes, we can stand before him with doors open wide in welcome.



From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Advent is our most counter -cultural season. While the secular world puts out the Christmas decorations by Halloween, the Church does not begin to celebrate Christmas until the evening of December 24th. The Advent Season is similar to preparing for a visit from a close friend or beloved family member. Lots of preparation needs to be made, and our joy is not complete until the loved one arrives. But the preparation itself is a happy time. I want to express our gratitude to our Altar Society for preparing our Advent decor.

In today's Gospel, John the Baptist speaks about what's to come. It's going to be different. It's going to be better. When the Messiah comes, something amazing is going to happen. "I have baptized you with water," John says, but "he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." With the coming of Christ, we move from water to Spirit-in other words, from the natural to the supernatural. Jesus takes our lives to a new level. But we have to be ready to join in on this spiritual journey. That's why John went around baptizing people for the repentance of their sins. He wanted to be sure their spirits were open to the Spirit. He wanted to help them be ready when the time came.

During Advent, we take a similar approach. We focus on what lies ahead: the coming of Christ. Of course he already came at the first Christmas when he was born of the Virgin Mary. Certainly, part of this season involves preparing for Christmas when we remember this original "advent" of the Lord. But another important element of these days is to make ourselves ready for the second coming of Christ. This is the moment for which we must always be ready. But we have an advantage that John's followers did not have. We already have the Spirit of the Lord in our hearts as baptized Christians.

Now, the Lord himself is at work in our souls to prepare us for his return. The question is only how cooperative we are going to be in the process. How attentive will we be to the promptings of this Holy Spirit which are often as quiet as a whisper? Let's be sure, during the busy pre-holiday bustle, to set aside enough quiet time that we can properly "prepare the way of the Lord" by listening to his voice.

I hope that our Advent reflection booklets, 'The Word Among Us,' and our opportunityy to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturday December 20 will prove to be beneficial for your spiritual journey as we prepare to celebrate Christmas.

This Monday, December 8th, is the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary.** Under that title, Mary is the patroness of the United States. It is a holy day of obligation. Our Mass schedule is 8am and 7pm.
