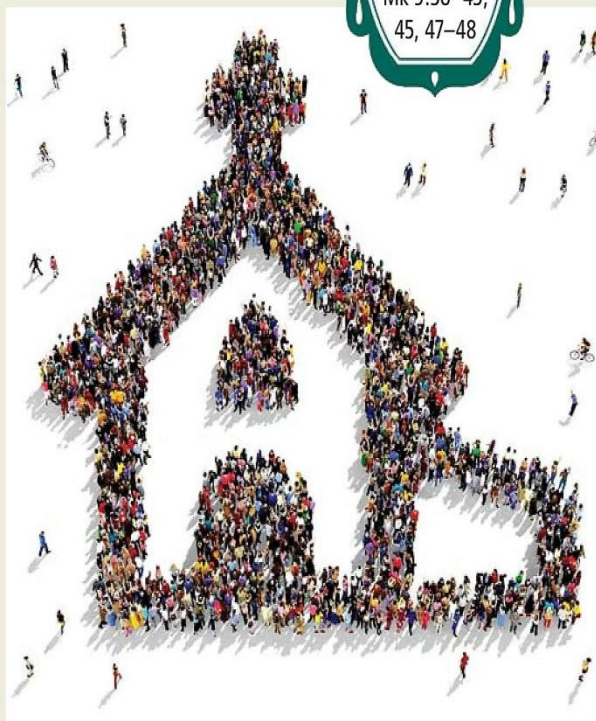


One of the great religious scandals is the multiplication of Christian denominations. Fueled partly by arguments about structure, Scripture, and theology and emphasis on individual autonomy (“I don’t like what you’re doing so I’ll start my own church”), the number has risen over the last few centuries into the hundreds. We can be certain this isn’t what Jesus intended. His frequent prayer was “that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you” (John 17:21). But Jesus knew the human temptation to exclude those whom we do not like or understand. The call for oneness can be distorted into the call for exclusiveness, with a select few deciding who’s in and who’s out, depending on criteria they alone decide.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus reminds the disciples that they are not the sole recipients of spiritual gifts or divine grace. Perhaps remembering the account in Numbers, Jesus gently points out that those who preach, heal, or cast out demons in his name are not doing wrong simply because they are not part of the twelve. They, too, can be part of Christ’s mission. Jesus reminds them (and us) of the catholic (universal) nature of the body of Christ. I think this, in some way, prepared them for the spread of Christianity throughout the world.

As Catholics we are diverse and unique. We are also united to many Christian brothers and sisters through our common, Trinitarian baptism. And so we pray for the day that all people will be one in the fullness of Christ’s power and truth.

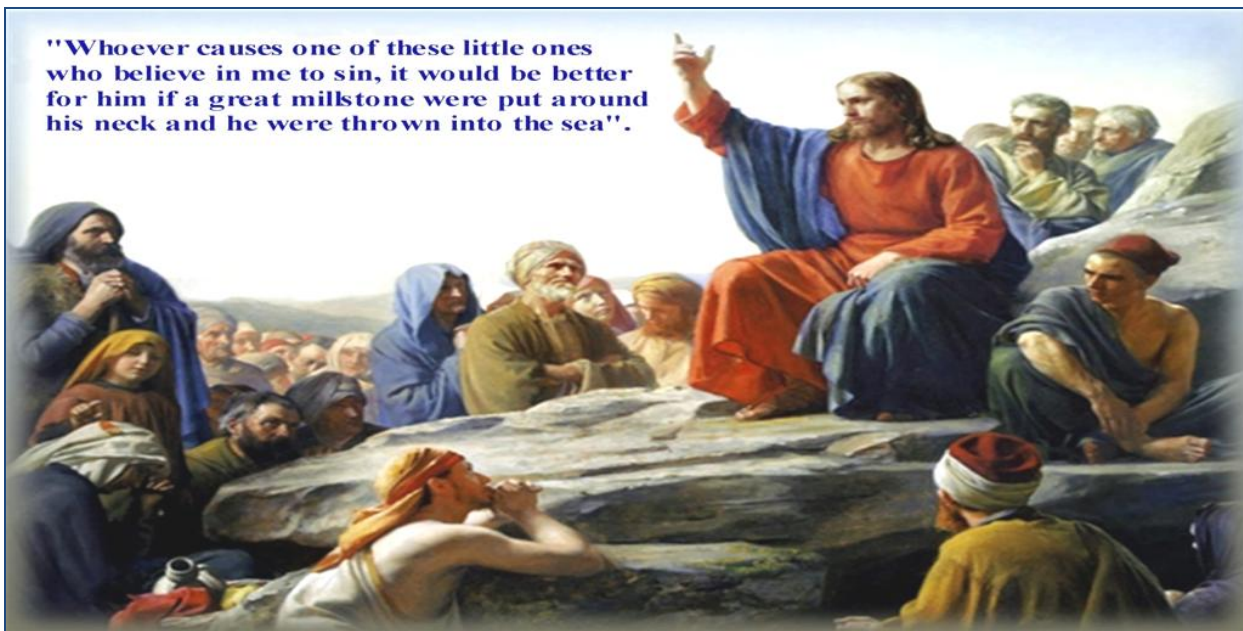

From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Tell him to stop because he does not follow us. This is what the disciples bring to Jesus because someone is casting out demons in the name of Jesus, it's working, but is not one of the disciples. Notice that the disciples want the person to stop because he is not 'one of us,' or does not follow us. It's interesting that the disciples do not say the person is not a disciple of Jesus, which includes more than the twelve. They say he is not one of us and does not follow us. They had a conviction of being the only ones through whom Jesus could work his miracles. It hurts to admit that there might be followers of other religions that might be better than us.

"The principle suggested by Jesus is clear: 'anyone who acts on behalf of man is one of us.' The Spirit is not a monopoly of the ecclesiastical structure; it is as free as the wind...The Spirit acts in the Church and outside it." cf.

This is the temptation any of us gets caught up in the moment we experience some sort of success and want it to be exclusive. We can find it difficult to hear of the success of another person in a similar line of work, etc. Jesus calls us to fidelity and faithfulness to him. Ambition that is not oriented toward service to others and inclusion of others ultimately ends in corruption of power and neglect of duty to God and neighbor.

Where is my focus? Is it on power and ambition alone or do we respond using our gifts and talents in the service of one another?
