I didn't have a calendar for a long time and prided myself on keeping my schedule and my children's schedule in my head. Then came the week I missed three appointments and realized I could no longer rely on my memory. Now I live by my calendar. Appointments, meetings, and to-do lists are neatly in their appropriate slots, and the calendar is the first thing I look at in the morning and the last thing I see before I leave the office. There isn't a lot of time for anything else. This begs the question: When does being a saint get space in my day?

Saints are so transparent to God that God's grace simply flows through them. And we are all called to sainthood, to holiness, regardless of what we do or who we are in the world. We have the mistaken notion that the saints spent all their time doing religious or

spiritual things and that if their schedules were like ours, there would be fewer of them. We couldn't be further from the truth. Saint Paul—when he wasn't planting churches, writing letters, or preaching the Good News—was spending more than a little time in prison. I don't think sainthood was really on his to-do list. Nor did he schedule being holy in between travels. His sainthood came from hearing the voice of God, obeying it, and incorporating it into whatever he was doing.

Shoehorning prayer and study into our schedules may be just what we need, and we must allow God to help us find and become the saint in the midst of each of our lives.

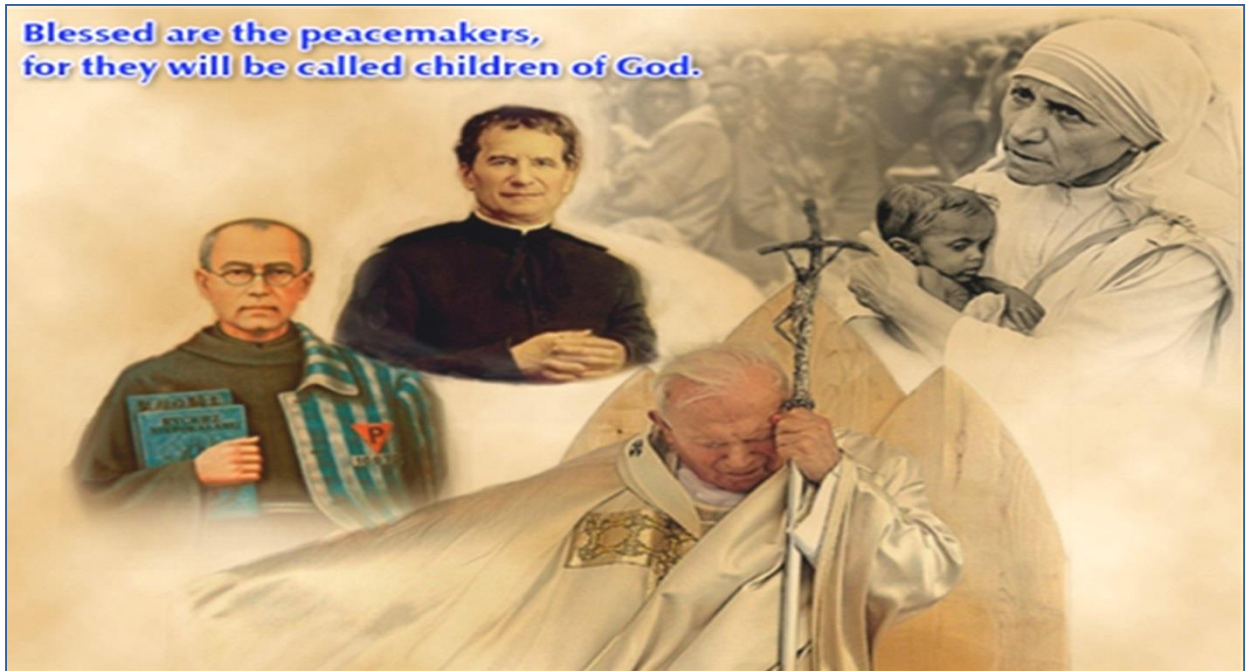

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

"For All The Saints, who from their labors rest..." We celebrate this Sunday recognizing all the redeemed who are in heavenly glory and ask them to pray with us to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The Church 'Canonizes' certain people who are now living in heavenly glory. The purpose of this is to provide examples of a holy life lived out in various ways and vocations. When it comes to canonized saints there is somebody for everybody.

We identify with a particular saint(s) and how they lived out their vocation here on earth, whether that be marriage, single life, religious (deacon, priest, and bishop). I often remark that if someone does not believe in asking a saint to intercede, (pray with them to the Lord) then they really do not believe in the existence of eternal life and the glory of heaven. If the saints actually live in glory then they are alive and do exist and can pray with us just like when we ask someone on earth to pray with us, or when we offer to pray for someone.

All Souls Day recognize those on their journey to the fullness of God's glory but are in the final process of purification to be fully in glory. To be fully in the presence of the living God and see Him face to face requires us to be free of all moral disharmony, i.e. sin, or even the stain of sin. Purgatory is the cleaning up of the last vestiges of any stains in a person's life as they moved from this world to the presence of the living God. So, both All Saints and All Souls are great times in the church to rejoice in those who have gone on before us and await our arrival in the Kingdom of God. Have a great week!
