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

The prophet Isaiah describes John the Baptist as the one who prepares the way of the Lord. He will do this by preaching to and baptizing those who come to him. The preparation for the coming Messiah is in his hands. He poses the question, "Are you ready for the one who is to come?" Thinking beyond our religious practices and Christmas preparations, what does that really mean for us? Maybe this year it means looking into our own hearts for the longing for Christ. Perhaps we will make a room for him in our busy lives and our busier thoughts. We might even stop our preparations long enough to remember just who is coming and invite him in. Are you ready?



From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

"...and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." Luke 3:6

What a profound statement today in this gospel of Luke. The readings of today are full of hope and joy. An invitation by John the Baptist for those seeking salvation to turn away from sin and remove everything that prevents us from crossing the Jordan into the promise land. The fuller sense of today's readings combined is the infinite redemptive love of God for his people. God will remove every obstacle that keeps us from Him. Our God is a jealous God. In a sense we could say the intensity of his love demands our love but at the same time leaves us free to accept or reject him.

Our reciprocal love of God is full of sin, pride, jealousy, greed, lust, and on and on. We are all flesh. "All flesh will see the salvation of God! (Lk 3:6) Not 'every man', but 'all flesh' says the original text. In the biblical sense, meat are not the muscles, but the whole person considered in his appearance of being weak, fragile, exposed to so many failures. Man is flesh because he gets sick, makes mistakes, suffers loneliness abandonment, grows old and dies. Here then is the promise: in every man's weakness God's salvation will manifest itself; there will be no abyss of guilt so deep and dark that will not be visited and enlightened by his love....God does not reserve his salvation to some privileged people, but wants it to be offered to all. No one will be excluded.

The Sacrament of Reconciliation

Reconciliation is a sacrament instituted by Christ in which forgiveness of sins committed after baptism. It is granted through the priest's absolution to those who with true sorrow confess their sins and promise to satisfy for the same. It is called a "sacrament" because it is an outward sign instituted by Christ to impart grace to the soul. It comprises

the actions of the penitent in presenting himself or herself to the priest and accusing of his/her sins, and the actions of the priest in pronouncing absolution and imposing satisfaction. With the Season of Advent fast upon us and the Birth of Christ eminent, the Sacrament of Reconciliation has been scheduled to be on Wednesday Dec. 16 at 6:30 pm.

Immaculate Conception of Mary Solemnity

Tuesday December 8th, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary which is a holy day of obligation. Under that title, Mary is the patroness of the United States. We will celebrate Mass at 8am and 7pm at St. Ann. I wish you a wonderful Advent.
