
Jos 5:9a, 10-12 + 2 Cor 5:17-21 + Lk 15:1-3, 11-32

ne of the deep meanings of this Gospel reading is signaled in verse 2: "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." Last Sunday, Jesus challenged the people to realize they were no better than those they condemned. The Pharisees and scribes had trouble with that lesson. They felt morally superior and more entitled to God's favor than those whose lives they questioned. Jesus turned that attitude on its head, showing time and again that God seeks out the sinner and the lost, particularly those who recognize that they are sinners and lost. As long as the Pharisees and scribes did not see themselves that way, Jesus could not help them.

Dictionary.com Unabridged says prodigal means "wastefully or recklessly extravagant," so someone who is prodigal is lavish, a spendthrift. According to the Pharisees, Jesus was prodigal, for they considered his welcome of sinners as wildly wasteful, frittering away time and resources on people they thought were unworthy. But Jesus simply was showing them, and all of us, what God's love is like. God is extravagant in his love for saints and sinners alike. To some it might seem pointless or unjust to love and care for sinners and enemies, but God finds no one unworthy or unlovable—even those who reject him and oppress others.

Lent is a time to accept our sinfulness, our lost condition, and return home to the Father. Like the father of the prodigal son, God waits for that warm embrace, willing to give us everything. Hurry now.

From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

This Sunday's Gospel, the Prodigal Son, reveals God's great love for us. In this parable Jesus emphasizes that God the Father is rich in mercy, always ready to forgive. In the Gospel Jesus reaches out to those who are sinners and the Scribes and Pharisees, who are also sinners, but did not realize it!

In the Gospel, the loving father is God. The younger son is the sinner and his older brother is likened to the Scribes who were sinners. God the Father called both sons to rejoice. He said his son was dead but had come back to life. His brother could not believe the father's forgiveness. He refused to forgive his younger brother. The fruit of the parable is very deep. The ring that the younger son was given was always saved for the older son. The cloak that was put on the younger son was always saved for the eldest son who would inherit his father's land and goods. The sandals were also saved for the eldest son to show his value, and the fatted calf was saved for the celebration of the chosen son. All this went to the younger son to show he was dead and had come back to life.

The older brother could not forgive his brother. He couldn't understand his father's love and forgiveness, very much like the Scribes and the Pharisees who are self-righteous and judgmental. They can see that other people sin, but they cannot see that they themselves also sin by their failure to forgive and love. Will they accept the invitation that God offers them an invitation to the Kingdom of God, or will they fail to repent and thereby refuse the invitation? God is calling all of us to repent during this season of Lent. God the

Father reaches out to us with a loving invitation.

This Lent, let us undertake a very candid and honest examination of our consciences, and address our own sin and weaknesses. We all have them! There is absolutely nothing to fear in approaching the sacrament of reconciliation for the reception of the mercy of our unconditionally loving Lord! A new Springtime is in store for us all this Season of Lent and this approaching Easter Season! May we draw ever nearer our God Who is calling and inviting us!
