Lenten Season Begins:

“In Him we have redemption through His blood,
the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the
riches of God’s grace that He lavished on us.
With all wisdom and understanding”

What is Lent...

And how do we do it?

The Lenten season developed as part the
Historical Christian calendar and is typically
Celebrated by Catholics, Orthodox Christians,
and even some mainline Protestant churches
that follow a liturgical calendar. Although its
format has varied throughout the centuries and
throughout different cultures, the basic concept
remains the same: to open our hearts to God’s
refining grace through prayer, confession and
fasting.

Confession – is to reconcile man to God.
When we sin, we deprive ourselves of God’s
grace. And, by doing so, we make it even easier
to sin some more. In the Sacrament of
Confession, grace can be restored to our souls,
and we can once again resist sin.

Fasting – is a way of denying ourselves the
excesses and distractions of life so that we
might be more aware of the Lord’s voice. It is
also a way of disciplining yourself, strengthening
your “Spiritual Muscles” so to speak, that when
temptations arise in life, you are already used to
saying “no” to your desires.

Finally, the act of fasting is also a way of
participating, in a small way, in the sufferings of
Christ. This is particularly powerful when
accompanied by prayer and Confession.
