From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Today's Gospel story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead serves as a preparation for the resurrection of Jesus. Lazarus was already dead for four days. But the "four days" also stand in contrast to the "three days" that Jesus is truly dead before His resurrection and begins to hint at the fundamental difference between them. When Jesus called Lazarus from the tomb, his hands and feet were still bound with burial bands and his face was still wrapped in a burial cloth, symbolically indicating that, although he has been restored to life, he is destined to die again he is still bound by the power of death. But the Risen Jesus left behind in His tomb the burial cloths that bound Him in death, symbolically indicating that His resurrection signifies the definitive victory over the power of death. Unlike Lazarus, He is no longer bound by the power of death and will never die again. The resuscitation of Lazarus from death invites us to believe in Jesus as "the resurrection and the life". the one who offers us a share in His victory over the bonds of death in an eternal life with its future and present dimensions. Whoever believes in Jesus has the hope that he "will live" eternal life in the future after he has died physically. And whoever "lives and believes" in Jesus "will never die" spiritually in this life but will live even now the eternal life that continues after our physical death. The Gospel today calls us to reflect on Baptism as a dying and rising with Jesus. In Baptism we die to sin's power over us, rising as children of God. In Baptism we join ourselves with Christ, who conquered death once and for all so that we who believe in him may have eternal life. With Martha and Mary, we are called to profess our belief that Jesus is indeed the Resurrection and the life.

Next Sunday, April 13, is **Passion (Palm) Sunday**, the beginning of Holy Week. You are welcome to bring with you palms from your yards.

We continue to celebrate the Third Scrutiny for our RCIA elect and candidates this week. In the Scrutinies we pray that those joining our Church at Easter be more resistant to the effects of original sin as well as whatever evil for which they are personally responsible. May God pour out His blessings upon you this week!
