What is the best way to dispose of palms?



How do we dispose of last year's palms?

Every year on Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday), palm branches are handed out and blessed as a powerful reminder of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem.

We keep palm branches for two reasons. First, they symbolize our desire to accompany Christ through Holy Week. Second, they symbolize Jesus' desire to enter our homes and accompany us on our journey as we face our own Good Fridays. Taking the palms home and placing them behind a crucifix or holy picture is a powerful reminder of that.

Many parishes ask their members to bring the palm branches they received the previous year to church on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday. These branches are burned to make the ashes that are distributed on Ash Wednesday. After a time, palm branches get brittle and break easily, so if your church doesn't collect them it's OK to break the palms up and burn them yourself.

The number of palm branches we have in our homes isn't important. Palms and other articles of devotion such as medals and scapulars don't bring good luck or wealth, and we shouldn't try to use them in that way. We should use them to remind us of the goodness of God and the salvation Jesus brings us.



From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The Church's solemn liturgy for Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion begins by recalling the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. The people, deeply moved by his preaching of the Kingdom and his works of healing, welcome Jesus into the holy city with shouts of "Hosanna to the Son of David." The liturgy then invites us to join in procession with these words on our lips as we enter into worship. Later we are invited to listen to the proclamation of the Passion detailing the betrayal, suffering, and death of Jesus. The contrast between these two scenes could not be more dramatic. We go from one emotional extreme to the other. Welcome and triumph are changed into rejection and loss. However, there is no contradiction in the Gospel message.

The account of the Passion is taken from the Gospel of Matthew and it emphasizes how what is taking place fulfills the plan of God revealed in the Scriptures. Nothing that happens is accidental or mere coincidence. Matthew points out that Jesus, the humble servant and Son of God, in spite of what is done to him, remains the master of his own destiny. He embraces these events in obedience and fidelity to the mission he has received from his Father.

As we prepare to enter into this sacred time which we call Holy Week, we are invited to reflect on the meaning and significance of Jesus Christ in our lives. We recognize him as our Savior but we are asked to contemplate what kind of Savior he really is. We have a Savior who was lifted up and exalted precisely because he emptied himself completely of his divine prerogatives. He became one of us in order to show us how to live as human beings. He was lifted up because he was first willing to surrender himself to the will of the Father. Thus, we have a Savior who first offered himself for us and then continues to offer himself to us as an example to follow. As he was willing to empty himself for our sake, so we must be willing to empty ourselves for the sake of others. During this Holy Week let us ask the Lord Jesus to teach us once again how to follow in his Please give special attention to the schedule for all of our Holy Week services in our bulletin today. Participating in our Holy Week Services is a fitting way to conclude our Season of Lent. I want to encourage you to join us in this most solemn celebration of the entire Church year. Beginning with the blessing of the new fire, the Easter Vigil recounts all of salvation history culminating in baptism and the renewal of our baptismal promises.

Our Liturgy committee, liturgical ministers, choir and musicians and those who decorate the church are all working hard to prepare for the Sacred Triduum. We want to thank them for the generosity of their time and talent.

Along with the other priests and deacons of our Diocese, I will participate in the Chrism Mass at 10:30 a.m. at Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Cathedral Parish on Tuesday, April 15th. At this Mass, Bishop Roger P Morin blesses the Oils of Chrism, Catechumens and the Sick which are then sent to every church parish for their celebrations of the Sacraments during the coming year.

Please keep our elect in your special prayers this Week. At our Easter Vigil on Saturday evening, they will be celebrating the Sacraments of Initiation (i.e. Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation). May God especially bless us during this holy time of year. Please continue to pray for one another and our parish.
