Dear Padre,

If I still attend Mass, may I work or shop on Sundays?

When I lived in Brazil, everything was closed on Sunday except a few restaurants. As a result, it was a day families could spend together. Even in our own country, some places have shortened hours on Sundays or are closed altogether, like banks and car dealerships.

For many of us, shopping is a way of resting. We go to the store and browse, stop at the mall, or see a movie. The *Catechism* doesn't go so far as to say we can't shop on Sundays. It tells us, "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are to refrain from engaging in work or activities

that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy, and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body" (CCC 2185).

However, many people have to work on Sundays. Even if we are resting by shopping or going out on Sundays,



we are forcing other people to work. If we all made the choice to not shop or go out on Sundays, with the exception of emergency needs, Sundays could truly become a day of rest for all people, as it is intended to be.

So yes, you may shop on a Sunday, but I would encourage you to spend the day doing things that keep the whole day holy, not just the hour you're at Mass.



From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

"I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture."

Jesus presents himself as the gate, i.e. gatekeeper in this Sunday's gospel. In other parts of the gospel he presents himself as the Good Shepherd. So which is he, gatekeeper or shepherd. He is both.

When shepherds were out in the country and hills with their sheep they needed to find shelter and security overnight so they could rest with the assurance that their sheep will be protected from robbers, thieves and wild animals. They worked this situation as a team of shepherds, each with their own flock.

Out in the fields there were situated fenced in areas, usually with stone. Planted on top of the stone walls were thorn bushes and the like to make it difficult for anyone to climb over the wall. It is here that shepherds out in the field would bring their flocks during the night. So, any one night could have a number of shepherds using one protected area to keep their sheep overnight. This stoned/fenced in area of course had a gate through which the sheep were brought in at night and out in the morning.

During the night one of the shepherds would sit at the gate protecting the sheep from any threat. No one could get to the sheep without going past the shepherd guarding them. When Jesus refers to himself as the Good Shepherd and the gate/

gatekeeper he is one and the same person. So Jesus is not only the Good Shepherd who leads us through life. He also guards us during times of rest. He is with us 24/7.
