Dear Padre,

Pope Francis said, "Who am I to judge?" But aren't we supposed to hold each other to a higher standard of living and judge actions as moral or sinful?

Pope Francis is not the only one to warn about judging. He is likely drawing his guidance from Jesus in Matthew 7:1–2. Both the Lord and the pope warn us about judging others and looking down upon those we consider "more sinful." That sort of comparison can easily lead us to arrogance and hypocrisy.

The Lord teaches us there will be a final (or particular) judgment each of us will have to face. We will all have to stand before God and give an account of our



actions. This teaches us that God is the only one qualified to fully know a person's heart and intentions. If we begin to act as a judge of people, then we are playing God.

However, your question also implies that among believers we are to hold one another accountable in our Christian community. This is correct (Matthew 18:15–17). In the body of Christ, there is a responsibility to help and encourage

each other to follow Jesus. Among the baptized, there should be the sharing of virtues and some accountability to the Church. We call one another higher, not through accusation, but through love and service. It is my duty to help fellow believers in their discipleship, as it is their duty to help me with mine. I find that I appreciate those who care enough about me to want to help me be a better Catholic, priest, or person. In community, we should build up in fellowship, not tear down in judgment.



From Father Khoa's Desk...

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

"Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you? Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."

Gossip and the unwillingness to forgive are some of the greatest offenses to God that occur on a daily basis. The unwillingness to forgive and to remain in judgment over another is not only detrimental to entering the kingdom of God; it also severely affects our relationships and our health on this earth. The unwillingness to forgive can destroy many of our relationships and in the end it can even kill us. If I don't know how to begin forgiveness of another then I ought to seek help and learning the tools of forgiveness.

To be a Christian means to forgive the inexcusable, because God has forgiven the inexcusable in you. This is hard. It is perhaps not so hard to forgive a single great injury. But to forgive the incessant provocations of daily life, to keep on forgiving the bossy mother-inlaw, the bullying husband, the nagging wife, the selfish daughter, the deceitful son, how can we do it? Only, I think, by remembering where we stand, by meaning our words when we say in our prayers each night 'forgive our trespasses as we forgive those that trespass against us.' We are offered forgiveness on no other terms. To refuse it is to refuse God's mercy for ourselves. There is no hint of exceptions and God means what He says."

This weekend is Catechetical Sunday. This year's theme is "Living as Missionary Disciples." Catechetical Sunday is a wonderful opportunity for all us to reflect on the role that we each play, by virtue of our Baptism, in handing on the faith and being a witness to the Gospel. We will acknowledge those who share in the teaching mission of the church.
